## PRESIDENT'S REPORT - Mr. Vince Ebejer

I would like to welcome you all to our 2014 Annual General Meeting. It is an honour to present my report as your President.

The GSDCV operates in a dynamic and fluid environment where we are well aware of the demands that today's society places on our members, officers and the Breed itself. We are constantly trying to improve what we offer and whether it be to the membership or the public, our structure and the goal is the same, the improvement, promotion and protection of the German Shepherd Dog.

The GSDCV is much more than the sum of its parts. We have had an outstanding year, continuing to build upon the foundations laid down long ago, strengthening the organisation to protect and promote the GSD. I wish to thank our long term members, they provide a connection to our past that is essential to the Club and the Breed. While we are forever looking forward, to know where we are going we need to know where we have been.

This past year we have seen an increase in membership and further progress along projects previously started. Each area or project of the GSDCV is chaired and driven by an individual, and the numerous position holders, the Executive and Management Committee have operated professionally throughout the year, often putting in countless hours after their 'day' jobs for the benefit of the members and the Breed. The GSDCV is a collaborative effort, with each group made up of members working together to ensure the success and smooth running of the organisation. To them I say a very big Thank You.

I would like to thank our major sponsor, "Royal Canin". The ongoing relationship between the GSDCV and Royal Canin grows stronger every year. Royal Canin and the GSDCV have continued their long term relationship during 2013 and Royal Canin will continue as the Club's major sponsor for 2014. The relationship is one we cherish and benefits both the GSDCV and Royal Canin. Through our relationship with Royal Canin, we continue to offer members through our Branch structure, access to Royal Canin premium pet food at significant savings, as well as seminars ranging from education to general information and interest topics. We are pleased to announce that Royal Canin has agreed to sponsor the 2015 GSDCA National Show & Trial. This will be held at KCC Park on the 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> of May 2015. A National Show and Trial Committee has been formed and planning is underway to make this an outstanding event.

I would also like to thank Monash Veterinary Clinic. They have been sponsors of the GSDCV for the past three years and I am pleased to announce that this will continue for 2014. The GSDCV and the Clinic have a very strong relationship forged over the many years that members have been taking their GSD's and other pets there. The staff and Veterinarians are extremely capable and well versed in canine issues and I am sure the relationship will continue in coming years.

During 2013, the Club redesigned and updated its logo. We did not undertake this lightly as we are conscious of our heritage. Receiving input from all our members through the branch structure, taking place over many months, we achieved a final design incorporating a strong GSD head, thus keeping our connection to our past. Along with the map of Victoria, it clearly symbolises what we are and what we stand for. This new design allows us to produce a consistent image across all platforms and the new logo will be phased in over time to allow for natural attrition of assets and uniforms.

Significantly, the GSDCV, in partnership with the Royal Agricultural Society of Victoria, held a GSD Specialist Conformation Show featuring SV judge Herr Hans-Peter Fetten (Gmy) at the Royal Show in September. 'The Royal' is the highlight of the 'All Breeds' Calendar and the provision of critiques and grading's for the GSD's, something not usually seen at the Royal, was a great opportunity to showcase the breed to the general public. It was truly a cooperative effort with many parts meshing together. The large entry featuring both Stock Coat and Long Stock Coat, including some well known interstate animals, combined with commentary from our Breed Surveyors' captivated the public's attention, as did the precision obedience work from our Demonstration Team which conducted displays for the entire time the Royal was open. The GSDCV Promotions Team did an outstanding job of dealing with the public, with a well manned promotions stand, information flyers and banners featuring our new logo. The promotional aspects of this event are without measure, with in excess of 20 thousand people attending the Royal on the day of the Show, and in excess of 150 thousand over the course of the 'Royal', not to mention the television coverage. We will certainly be endeavouring to hold the event in 2014.

## **BREED AFFAIRS ADMINISTRATOR – Mr Ian Urie**

This concludes my second year as Breed Affairs Administrator, and I wish to thank all the members of the Breed Affairs committee (especially my Assistant Vince Tantaro, and Secretary Mellissa Siktars) as well as all of the Registrars, Breed Surveyors, Position Holders, Breed Liaison Officers, Tattooists, and Show Instructors for the work you have done on behalf of the Club during the last year. Congratulations to two of our Instructors who are being recognized at this AGM with awards for their service over many years. Frank Valastro has completed thirty years as a Show Instructor and Carole Osborne ten years. Thank you both for your dedication and assistance to your fellow Club members.

Thanks are also due to the Show Committee, led by Andrew Jones and Vicki Dobson, who put on some very well run events throughout the year. This year in addition to our usual shows, we had for the first time a specialist judge at the Melbourne Royal Show, where Herr Hans Peter Fetten was the first German SV judge to officiate at such an event, and fittingly an imported German VA dog, Ustinov vom Romerland, was awarded Best of Breed. Many thanks to the breed promotion stand volunteers and demonstration team members, as well as Breed Surveyors Jenny Yuen and Fran Farley who provided public commentary, for making this an excellent public promotion for our breed. Judges for our Championship Shows were Mr. Imran Hussain (Pakistan) in March at KCC Park, and Herr Hans-Peter Schweimer and Ms. Melanie Groth in November at Sunbury. Mrs. Jenny Yuen judged the 2013 State Breed Exhibition. Mr. Andrew Jones judged our 2013 Open Show, and it has been quite some years since we have had a GSDCV member officiating at that event. Victorian exhibitors had much success again at the 41<sup>st</sup> National Show and Trial held in Adelaide, including in Stock Coat classes both the Gold and Silver Medal winning bitches, Bronze Medal dog, Puppy Dog, Minor Dog and Bitch, and Baby bitch winners. In Long Stock Coat classes we had the Silver Medal dog, Intermediate Dog winner, Challenge Dog, and Junior Bitch winner. In the Obedience Trial Victorian exhibitors won two classes and also won the Gold and Silver Medals.

I wish to thank all on the Victorian Breed Survey panel for their services during the year, especially the State Breed Survey Coordinator Alastair Henderson, and Breed Survey Registrar Gillian Cafari. I was the GSDCV delegate at the GSDCA Breed Commission and Judges Committee meetings in July in Sydney, where Fran Farley and James Rodger were reinstated as Breed Surveyors. The annual Breed Seminar this year was very successful again. Speakers were Mr. Steve Moore from DEPI who spoke on the various laws affecting dog ownership in Victoria, Dr. Karen Hedberg who spoke on hereditary diseases in the breed, and also Vince Tantaro who once again presented the interactive discussion and powerpoint presentation "Let's Talk Dogs". The transcripts of these talks are available on the Club website, along with show results and other breed related articles.

Due to micro-chipping of all puppies being compulsory in Victoria the number of breeders utilizing the tattoo scheme has declined further. Club tattooists are still available however for those wishing to continue their use, but please give them at least four weeks notice if you require a booking. The GSDCV Puppy Booklets and 'Free Training Class Certificates' can be obtained from the Breed Liaison Officer at your Branch. Because many breeders have their own websites, or utilize sites such as Dogzonline for selling their puppies, the GSDCV Puppy Listing Service has again often suffered from a lack of litters to recommend to potential buyers. I ask all breeders to please support this free Club service in addition to any other avenues, because it is an important first point of contact for many people who may eventually become members of our organization. As well, buyers can be assured that the parents of any puppies listed have passed the GSDCA hip and elbow dysplasia control schemes and are Breed Surveyed. I thank Judy Eppinger for her continued dedication in the position of Puppy Listings Officer. Congratulations also to the winners of the various Perpetual Trophies, and thanks to Jenny Joseph for keeping the scores for the annual show trophies.

Please remember that breeders and interested members are always welcome to attend our Breed Affairs meetings. Whilst voting is only available to Branch Liasion Officers, elected position holders and Breed Surveyors, all members are welcome to come along and join in the discussions. The GSDCV is a breed-based Club, and breed issues are as important as training of dogs. I am not continuing as Breed Affairs Administrator next year as I will be returning to the role of Vice President, and I welcome Jenny Yuen back as our Chairperson for 2014.

In 2012 total entry numbers for SC were 684 and in 2013, 653. This is a 5% reduction. LSC entries overall in 2013 were 45, in 2012 (LSC only applicable to show in Nov 2012 - WDC /GSDCV weekend 19 were entered however in 2013 only 16.)

We are currently planning the National for 2015 and have brought together some eager volunteers with specialist expertise to assist in this very prestigious event for the GSD. Attached is a list of position holders and we also hope that others will render their assistance as the appointed individuals work through their responsibilities. The National Show & Trial Committee has met to formalise the structure for the show and will continue to schedule meetings to further firm up actions and progress.

In 2014 surveyors are hoping that they are able to more easily check the identification, teeth and measurement of animals presented for survey. On a number of occasions in 2013 animals behavior in this area left a lot to be desired. More emphasis should be put on practicing these exercises at their branches before submitting the animal for survey.

Once again I must thank Gillian Cafari who continues to deal with all the Survey applications and making sure paperwork is correct at each survey. Also I must thank our panel who ran the surveys on the occasions I could not attend and continue to give their time for the betterment of the German Shepherd.

Hoping all breeders and exhibitors continue to promote the breed survey scheme in 2014.



### Breed Survey Registrar – Mrs Gillian Cafari:

I would like to thank the Victorian Breed Surveyor Panel, led by Alastair Henderson as State Breed Survey Cooordinator, for another successful survey year where there was a decrease in the number of animals surveyed compared to the previous year. In August we welcomed back to the Surveyor Panel, Mrs. Frances Farley and Mr. James Rodger. We are indeed lucky in Victoria to have a large number of dedicated surveyors who make themselves available in the interest of further improving the GSD through the GSDCA Breed Survey scheme.

I would like to thank Alastair and all the Victorian Surveyors for their ongoing support. Thank you also to the Speciality Show Branch for hosting our Surveys and for the hospitality shown to the Surveyors and myself.

I also thank all the breeders and owners who support the Breed Survey scheme and wish you all a successful year in 2014.

#### <u>Hip/Elbow Dysplasia Registrar – Karen Ballantyne:</u>

GSDCV members and breeders continue to demonstrate their long term commitment to breed improvement by participating in the GSDCA National Hip & Elbow Control Scheme.

During 2013, 91 HD/ED forms (contracts) were issued to GSDCV members. Of these, 88 contracts were issued for hip and elbow assessment and 3 contracts were issued for resubmission of hips due to poor positioning (tilted) in previously submitted x-rays.

By way of a snapshot comparison:

- 10 years ago in 2003, 126 HD/ED forms (contracts) were issued to Victorian members. Of these, 121 contracts were issued for Hip and Elbow assessment and 5 were for Elbow assessment only; and
- 20 years ago in 1993, 208 forms were issued to Victorian members.

This decrease in the number of HD/ED contracts issued reflects the reduction in overall GSD breeding activity, rather than indicating any decrease in support for the scheme. The numbers of contracts issued over the last few years has been relatively stable.

Congratulations to Schaeferhund Kennels who were presented with the following National Breeder's Achievement Awards (HD Medallions) at the 41<sup>st</sup> National Show and Trial at Adelaide:

- <u>Bronze Medallion</u> Kennels that have bred 10 animals that have been awarded an 'A' stamp through the GSDCA Hip Dysplasia Control Scheme;
- <u>Silver Medallion</u> Kennels that have bred 25 animals that have been awarded an 'A' stamp through the GSDCA Hip Dysplasia Control Scheme; and
- <u>Gold Medallion</u> Kennels that have bred 50 animals that have been awarded an 'A' stamp through the GSDCA Hip Dysplasia Control Scheme.

I would like to thank Gill Cafari for her ongoing support and efficiency as Assistant HD/ED Registrar. I would also like to thank the GSDCA National Hip and Elbow Control Scheme Registrar, Doug West, and the National Treasurer, Jane Pike, for their support and friendly assistance during the year. Members really appreciate receiving their official 'A & Z stamp certificates soon after the 'pink slip'.

It is also pleasing to note that the fees for Hip & Elbow assessment during 2013-2014 have not changed for several years, thus keeping participation in the scheme affordable – unfortunately the same can't be said for the cost of x-raying!

There is no doubt that the strong support breeders and owners have demonstrated for the HD/ED scheme in the past is now reflected in the excellent hip/elbow results members are achieving. A high level of participation in the scheme is the only way Australian HD/ED scheme statistics can be representative of the producing abilities of individual sires. Breeders rely on representative and up-to-date statistics being available to assist their selection of better hip and elbow producing sires.

Good luck with your X-raying during 2014.

#### Assistant HD/ED Registrar's Report 2013 – Gillian Cafari:

I would like to thank the Club's HD/ED Registrar, Karen Ballantyne for her support in keeping us supplied with contracts and liaising with the National Registrar when supplies become low. Karen also looks after the reporting requirements as Registrar, many thanks for tending to this. I issued 76 forms for the year, one for hips only and 75 for hips and elbows. As these forms are provided by mail I regularly receive phone calls about the forms and thank the members for their courtesy with their enquiries.



#### Tattoo Registrar – Mr Michael Blunt:

#### Puppy Listings Registrar – Ms Judy Eppinger:

This year the number of puppies listed on Puppy Listings was just under 200 which was marginally less than 2013, although there were more older dogs six to nine months listed.

The number of people seeking a German Shepherd through the club continues to increase, and it is obvious from the questions posed to me that many prospective owners are accessing the information offered on the website. As we never have enough pups to meet the demand, it is apparent that many go elsewhere to buy a puppy usually from a litter where if they are lucky at least one parent will be breed surveyed, but at least many will know to ask about hip and elbow scores. I have also begun getting requests from people interested in breeding GSDs who know very little about what is involved, and most likely see it as a way to make money. This situation is probably a worry for all breed clubs.

Thanks to Jacinta Poole for all her help with the website - which certainly makes my job easier - and to everyone listing their puppies with the Club.

## **OBEDIENCE TRAINING ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT – Mrs Marilyn Wrigley**

It is with much pleasure that I, as training administrator of the German Shepherd Dog Club of Victoria Inc., present my report on behalf of the training committee members whom I sincerely thank for working together throughout the year which has been rewarded with very pleasing results in all areas of this committee.

On behalf of OTC and all obedience members I would like to sincerely thank all Branch Chief Instructors and Instructors for their commitment shown during 2013 in their line of duty within our club. The Chief Instructors for their leadership and dedication in order to make sure that each training day, at each branch training, is carried out for all obedience members with dedication, from the instructors in line within the guidelines of OTC to the standard of each class within those guidelines. I believe that the fun day results of each class is testament to this fact, as members from all branches compete in their class level and must be able to be at a competent class level to do that. Thank you from OTC and our branch members to CI's and instructors for teaching and upholding this standard of instructing over the last twelve months.

I thank those CI's who attend our monthly meetings throughout the year for their attendance and input at those meetings. I would strongly encourage those not attending these meetings that they put on their agenda for the ensuing year that they make a concerted effort to change that situation in 2014, as we want all our committee to be well informed from our meetings. Even much more important, is that they then discuss items from our meeting at their instructors meetings back at their branch, and also pass on information to members of their branches within the GSDCV Inc. One cannot do this effectively when relying on minutes from previous meetings or worse still, second hand information passed onto them. I and other members of OTC committee look forward to more participation by all at our monthly meetings. This situation is even more vital now than previous years as we have our new aspirers course happening and need information at times passed on by Chief Instructors to them and other instructors at their branch.

Obedience Aspirers Instructor Course: The introduction of our two year course for aspirers has been a major achievement of the Obedience Training Committee with the first induction receiving twelve applications with nine completing that course in 2013 and I sincerely thank those nine for their application and commitment to the course knowing that their services will be very valued by their various branches.



This year we had 25 applicants for the course from varied branches throughout the club but out of that number eight were from Western Branch, a remarkable effort to say the least. Our theory programme for 2013 was completed on October 19<sup>th</sup> with the breed lecture by James Rodger followed by those who were able to be present sitting the theory exam on November 30<sup>th</sup>. Despite all aspirers showing nervousness and apprehension, I am pleased to say all those who sat the exam passed with their pass rate ranging from 99.5% to 96% {required pass rate is 95%}, and it is clear by their exam papers that they have benefitted by being better informed by the lectures and handouts during their theory year. I thank those aspirers for their inspiring efforts and wish them well in their practical year at the metropolitan branches and their practical test.

I also wish to thank all who lectured on the many subjects covered throughout the year and whilst pleased with the overall result, advise that the committee will always be aware of upgrading the programme for an overall benefit of our aspirers at all times and make appointments to the committee running the aspirers course as necessary. Thank you to Chief Instructors who attended the lectures in support of their aspirers and helped out in many and varied ways—this help was greatly appreciated and I trust that attendance at these lectures will improve as qualified instructors can attend should they wish to do so. I thank the Western Branch for the use of their clubhouse and facilities for our lecture days as we truly appreciate being able to hold the lectures there where we have indoors and out door areas to facilitate our programme.

On behalf of myself, OTC and aspirers sincere thanks to Mark Stedwell for his outstanding input into putting the aspirers programme in place and for the professional manner which it is presented to our aspirers. I fully realise how busy Mark is, however I am sure that each aspirer proudly receives their folders and other information throughout the year, mostly all completed in club colours which would have to give the aspirer an appreciation of what they are undertaking. It makes a difference when someone takes the time to present to them their lecture notes/info in a most comprehensive and professionally presented folder. Thank you sincerely Mark. I am very confident we present to our aspirers the most comprehensive and informed obedience instructor course available and it is fitting that we remember that "it is a privilege to become an instructor not just a right"

We look forward with anticipation to our 2014 intake of aspiring obedience instructors who will then become an asset at their branch in training members to train their dogs.

I wish to report that OTC is reviewing our training manual and whilst we have done some work in this area there is not enough to report on at this stage. This review will be very extensive, ranging from puppy class right through to trialling and tracking, as well as new disciplines that have started up in the last two years. As this is a huge task it will of course take time to put in place. However, I can assure everyone that it will be better than what was used previously. Because of its size, it will be completed section by section. We have started on the process of gathering information that we hope will vastly improve our puppy classes and when that is complete we will look at continuing on some of those ideas through into higher classes, as well as progressing to a higher standard of teaching as members progress through classes. This will involve a number of workshop days and so I would think that it will take some time before we have it all done. However, at this stage, we anticipate that the puppy class training manual will be finished mid to late 2014.

## Promotions Officer – Mrs Dearne Jackson

2013 has been a busy year with many large and small events being attended by the GSDCV (either formally or informally) to get our breed in the public spotlight in a positive sense.

Every branch does activities in their local community as part of festivals, pet/produce store open days, regional RSPCA Million Paw Walks, radio talks, council pet days, "show" canteen/kiosks ...... the list just goes on of the formal things being done. If there is an opportunity to be involved in a community event, 95% of the time the GSDCV members are there to display or talk about what the club can provide and support for our beautiful breed.



Behind the scenes there are also individuals who quietly attend elderly citizen homes and palliative care units to visit elderly & ill residents, step forward and provide dogs for media photos when asked, attend funerals as guards of honour with their dogs or as individuals take their dogs to cafes and have "coffee dates". During these outings the dogs become an attraction and the opportunity to talk about our wonderful breed is rarely lost by the dog's proud owner(s). I have to thank all those members who cheerfully became involved in the organising and participation of these events both big and small/formal and informal, right across the state. Without your help none of this would happen. If I single an individual out then I will be under valuing each and every other individual's contribution so I won't do that. It's a team effort by every member of the GSDCV.

While not downgrading the importance of the small events attended in local areas, the GSDCV took part in some major events in 2013. In **February**, the Melbourne Pet and Animal Expo returned to the Royal Melbourne Showgrounds after many years being at Caulfield Racecourse. The GSDCV had a breed stand and demo team in on each of the event days.

**March** saw the GSDCV invited back to participate in the Melbourne Moomba Festival street parade as a guard of honour for the King & Queen Royal Float. The hot summer had changed the focus of the Royal float from individual king & queen to emergency service organisation acknowledgments. Instead of being in front of the Royal Float as originally intended, the GSDCV members walked in full parade uniform (supplied by the Moomba organisers) following the fire, police and ambulance members to close off the Royal section of the parade.

As our chosen dog breed participates in emergency services work it was fitting that we were there as well. Added value for the day was the official television coverage achieved and the many photos and YouTube video of the team that surfaced after the event.



**May** had the RSPCA Million Paws Walks happening around the state. Many branches participated in this event at the regional locations and in some instances also did demonstration displays as entertainment for the public present. The Royal Melbourne Show in **September** started with a breed spectacular day for the German Shepherds. A breed stand was provided along with a demonstration team (which did six separate days at the Royal) to showcase the GSD on the day. Every GSD exhibitor contributed to the day by redirecting public queries across to the breed stand and every dog in the show proved to be outstanding examples of the breed in their behaviour. **December** rounded out the promotions year with a large GSDCV presence at the Big Day Out for Dogs organised by Dogs Victoria at KCC Park.

Providing positive promotion of our breed to the public continues to be essential. With every year passing, the need to remain vigilant about what we do with our dogs and how they present when in the public remains a responsibility for each and every person who owns a GSD or holds one on the end of a lead. Again thanks for the help from everyone for taking the opportunity this year to be able to get out and promote this wonderful breed.

## **ReHoming Officer – Mr Mike Nelson**

The last six months of rehoming I have been led to believe have been slower than the reported turnover of the past. If this is indeed correct I think that there are a number of reasons this may be so:

1) We now operate strictly to the club guidelines of being a REHOMING service - that is dogs who are surrendered for re-homing by their owners.

2) Dogs with obvious behavioural problems are not placed for re-homing3) Persons who do not appear genuine or do not provide the correct forms

- to obtain a dog are not accommodated
- 4) There are less dogs being offered for re-homing than in the past

It is of interest and gratifying to note that quite a number of the people approaching the re-homing service have been directed from branch officials and other club members - it really good to see that members are aware of this service and are prepared to recommend it to others.

There has been 5 rehomings to date - all of which have turned out to be successful. A sixth re-homing is about to take place now to an ex-member a who had previously re-homed a dog.

We receive a small but steady stream of inquires both to re-home and/or acquire a dog - on average 6-8 calls per week. Approximately one third wanting to re-home their dog and two thirds wishing to get a dog. Among those wanting to access the service, there is a fair degree of misunderstanding as to the purpose and scope of the re-homing service - some believe it to be a rescue service for lost or maltreated dogs, a kennelling and placement service for dogs with various temperament or behavioural problems, others wanting specific requests such as "fully trained dog" or "dog/bitch under 12 month but obedience trained".

A great success story – Samson was rehomed with an ex GSDCV member who took him on in a very poor state. He now lives in luxury!!





I had hoped to introduce a database system to better handle our re-homing history by the end of this year, but outside business commitments have caused this to be delayed but not forgotten.

I personally have felt this to be a worthwhile and rewarding service by our club for the benefit of the German Shepherd Dog in general.

## Shepherd News Editor – Ms Jacinta Poole

The written word has always been our key form of communication to members, via the 'German Shepherd News'. It is the GSDCV's key communication link to our members. In 2013 however, the German Shepherd 'ENews' was created as an adjunct to our hard copy news. The GSDCV's website is our central communication platform to both members and the public. Our use of electronic media provides us with a very powerful presence in the online and social media platforms. The GSDCV website continues to build content, report news and focus our promotion of the breed and club. The website one of the most valuable assets of the GSDCV, particularly in its ability to reach, teach and promote our club and the German Shepherd Dog. The power and impact of online communication continues to grow and we will continue to advance with our online presence.

Our 2013 electronic innovation that joined both the Website and Shepherd News platforms was the GSDCV's 'ENews'.

The Enews is delivered to members registered email address four times each year. Nonmembers can also subscribe via the website. The ENews is really a snapshot of GSD news or club highlights that are detailed by a few lines of text and the opportunity to follow a link to useful videos and is obviously in colour for pictures and text. Its aim is to promote the GSD in a more general context. By the December 2013 4<sup>th</sup> issue, we were emailing to a list of over 1500 people, with an open rate of close to 65%. Not bad for those interested in this format of communication!

We'll continue to expand on this format in the future, as it's also a great way to educate and promote to non-members about our breed and what we do.



The GSDCV Facebook page is heading towards 1300 'likes'. For clubs such as ours, the use of social media is crucial in communications. A majority of our members are active on Facebook, as are most of the general public. Many members from interstate clubs also keep track of our activities via our page.

It's a personal connection and it's instant. Our facebook page ensures we connect with them and it's just another way of ensuring our communication is the best possible and time relevant, using all the options we have available. Smartphones ensure the GSDCV is connected wherever and whenever. Branches that have facebook pages have also found them to be invaluable in connecting with members. Visit and 'Like' us at www.facebook.com/GSDCV

Promotion, education and communication to both our members and the general public is the main role of our website. Pictures and videos provide

an insight to our club events, activities and members. Picture slideshows enhances our show and trial results and for exhibitors also a memory of the event. For many they take the opportunity to access images of their dog during classes that they were unable to capture themselves. Images are freely provided by the GSDCV webmaster when available. Using videos for education and promotion is always beneficial and receives good feedback. Our veterinary and breed information pages are well utilised and popular. Videos of the Endurance Trial, Royal Show demo's, breed survey and junior handler's workshops are popular as still are our videos of the 2010 national show.

In February 2013 in conjunction with the Obedience Training Committee we launched the Instructors Knowledge Centre, a secure login area on our website for club instructors to access educational information relative to training dogs, and also for our aspirers to access course content. This area will continue to be developed.

Online entry capability for show and trial entry has grown in popularity, along with membership renewal. Online entries have proved to be a very useful service for members, with larger shows receiving well over 50% of entries and trials closer to 80% online via the website. The ability to enter dogs and pay by credit card at any time is a great convenience



for

many who prefer the ease of technology to paper, cheques and postage. Many other clubs and all breeds shows are now also heading this way. Our online payment for membership renewal is popular and simple. All credit card payments are handled by a secure processing facility with the NAB bank. The club absorbs the transaction fees that are incurred. We believe this is a valuable service for our members which we'll continue to develop, improve and expand.

Our branch websites remain a key component of our online presence and branches are encouraged to make the most of the communication opportunity for their members, as well as potential members seeking information on their local branch. Most have their own sites and have done a great job in reporting their branch news and successes for their members with branch specific info, slideshows and pictures which are always much appreciated and worth viewing. Keeping the information current is the most critical aspect, and branches have direct access to manage their sites themselves.

One of our most visited and popular areas by members of the public is Puppy listings, for all who may be potential owners. Most contact with the GSDCV puppy listing officer has been via the website and more importantly many have read the information pertaining to purchasing a puppy so are better informed and knowledgeable buyers. Breeders have also commented on the importance of this information when buyers come to them. Our rehoming pages are well visited, with many people looking to provide a great new home to one of the dogs available.

In the 12 months to January 2013 the GSDCV website had over 115,000 visitors. Our most popular pages are our puppy listings, and the popularity of show and event slideshows see in increase in our bandwidth traffic. The most read articles continue to be those on feeding and exercising puppies, the growth charts for GSD's and some of the other veterinary articles. Many people are seeking knowledge about GSD's and caring for them and it's important that we can provide that. There is always a big spike in visits when show critiques or trial results are published. At the same time any picture slideshows receive a high number of views.

The FAQ's area of the website is powered by flexAnswer iFAQ, an intelligent FAQ service generously provided by members Grant and Lin Milne from flexAnswer Solutions Pty Ltd. Since January 2009, flexAnswer iFAQ (previously aQtual) has answered over 35,000 questions and averages about 590 per month. The use of flexAnswer iFAQ allows us to expand the FAQs we provide based on the questions users actually type in and ask, so we hope we are helping teach GSD owners about our dogs and our club. FAQs are generally restricted to answers covering the GSD and the GSDCV.

Our club has several members who access the website to update specific areas, spreading the workload. Thankyou to Puppy listings Officer Judy Eppinger for her posting and managing of the litters on the Puppies Available page. Show and trial results and critiques is some of the most keenly awaited information we can provide. Our continued efforts to provide results quickly after events have been successful and appreciated. Thank you to show Secretary Vicki Dobson for the provision of results and critiques so quickly, to trial manager Dearne Jackson for the rapid provision of trial results and Marilyn Wrigley for tracking results. Thankyou to Jenny Joseph for provision of the eagerly awaited Points Score results updates.

Thankyou to Daryl Bourke who provides technical expertise behind the scenes when required for software updates, background code and host server issues.



We will continue to improve our website to ensure it remains as current, useful and informative as possible. The ENews will hopefully evolve into a key communication tool and aims to communicate and promote both the GSDCV and the GSD to anyone who's interested. 2013 proved a challenging year at the Malvern training branch, primarily due to infrastructure issues with our training venue. Membership has increased again over the past twelve months from 65 members in 2012 to 70 active members 2013. Our three local breeders are helping to increase Branch membership with some of the new puppy owners joining the Branch. Unfortunately the trend nowadays with new owners is to leave the Branch when their puppies obtain a reasonable standard of Obedience training, and due to outside influences and pressures are not interested in spending further time and effort continuing more Obedience training or training in another discipline with their canine friend, and tend not to rejoin after a twelve month period.

The Branch over the past twelve months again attended "Paws in the Park", held at Willow Park, Wodonga and in May the "RSPCA Million Paws Walk" in Albury and in November attended "Pets Day Out" held by the Albury City Council where we held nonstop demonstrations, with puppies on Positive Reinforcement Reward Based (food) Training, Obedience with our older dogs, performing tricks and a number of dogs socialising with the public from 8am till 12 noon. The Branch also set up an Obstacle Course for junior dogs and one for senior dogs with 15 different obstacles supervised by Branch personnel for course instruction and safety. This was a hit with the public, who as time permitted, attempted the courses several times. Two of our dogs attend on a weekly basis a local aged care hostel and socialise with the aged personnel and all have a wonderful time. The above publicity helps to promote the Branch and in particular our breed.

The Branch has only a small Instructional Team who have worked so very hard during the year to give our members personal instruction at all class levels. Training times had to be split starting with Puppy Class, Class 1 & 2 from 9am - 9.45am and Class 3 and above from 10am - 11am. This also leaves little time for the instructors to train their own dogs so I would like to say a special thank you to my instructors and of course to the Branch Committee for their hard work behind the scene, which at time is taken for granted.

Again this year in the *Show ring* a number of Branch members achieved Best of Breed Titles, Excellent gradings and placings. In the *Obedience Ring* Excellent passes in CCD, CD and CDX and in *Rally Obedience* Excellent passes in Novice and Advance A. A number of Branch dogs gained class 1 at Breed Survey also during the year. Congratulations to all.

On Easter Sunday after training the Branch held a BBQ at which the following presentations were made, one (1) 25 year Instructor's award, three (3) 25 year Membership awards, three (3) 10 year Instructor's awards, three (3) 10 year service awards, and one (1) 5 year service award, and two (2) Title medallions, a great achievement for such a small Branch.

On Saturday the 16<sup>th</sup> February the Branch conducted its first fundraising Sausage Sizzle at Bunnings in Wodonga and on 15<sup>th</sup> December its second which raised funds for the Branch to purchase new Agility equipment such as two Tunnels, Dog Walk, See–Saw, Hoop and six light weight jumps. 
