# **Club and Breed Information Sheet**

The German Shepherd Dog Club of Victoria Inc. (GSDCV) has produced this document to assist you in deciding whether a German Shepherd Dog (GSD) is the right dog for you and your family and to inform you of the services that the club provides.



The GSDCV is the official custodian of

the breed in Victoria and along with the other State Clubs is affiliated with the German Shepherd Dog Council of Australia (GSDCA). Together, these organisations work to safeguard the development of the breed in Australia through the various national breed improvement schemes. The GSDCV promotes both responsible dog ownership and responsible dog breeding and offers many services to members. The GSDCV is the largest single breed club in Australia today and has a long and strong history of which we are justly proud.

The German Shepherd Dog is a large, active and very intelligent breed which thrives on companionship. It is essential therefore that all prospective owners are prepared to cater for the dog's need for exercise, attention and mental activity. The GSD is known throughout the world for his loyalty, trustworthiness, intelligence, courage and a calm and good-natured temperament. These qualities make him ideally suited to training, plus a wonderful friend and companion.

#### **BREED DESCRIPTION**

The German Shepherd Dog is a strong, active, very intelligent, loyal dog making him an ideal family companion. He requires socialization, training and regular exercise to make him a good canine citizen.

The German Shepherd is a medium sized breed with male dogs standing between 60-66cms high at the withers and weighing between 30-42 kgs, bitches stand about 55-61cms at the withers and weigh 22-32 kgs. Having a double coat they do tend to shed and require a regular (weekly) brush/comb to remove loose hair.

The German Shepherd is also a working dog and as such is responsive to a wide range of training. He is employed in many roles including sheep herding, police, search and rescue and guide dogs for the blind. German Shepherd Dogs also currently serve with the Australian Defence Forces.

#### **BUYING A PUPPY**

Many people buy a cute little puppy without considering the future consequences of a much larger adult dog. In the right home that puppy will be a loved family member. It is a sad fact we destroy well in excess of 100,000 dogs each year in Australia.

All dog buyers must carefully consider the exercise, fencing, shelter and particularly the socialization and training requirements of a new puppy. Are you prepared

to find the time in your busy schedule to accommodate the demands of this new family member? You need to remember that this little puppy will, in a relatively short time become a much larger adult with a lifespan of approximately 10-14 years.

The initial purchase price is the commencement of outlay. Believe it or not a puppy can be quite costly over the course of its lifetime. You will need to budget for vaccinations, worming, food, council registration fees, membership fees etc. and the possibility of Veterinary expenses that can become quite high, sometimes running into the thousands. We recommend you purchase your puppy from a breeder who complies with the GSDCV Code of Ethics using the GSDCA Breed Improvement Schemes to assist as a safeguard towards good health and more importantly the sound character and temperament of your future family companion (see

below). You will find a list of puppies that have bred via been breed these improvement schemes on the GSDCV website. If you do go ahead and decide



purchase a puppy you must commence the puppy's socialisation and training from day one. This is essential. It is recommended that you join the GSDCV or another obedience dog club to assist you. The GSDCV has eleven training grounds situated in both metropolitan Melbourne and country Victoria. GSDCV membership is inexpensive and a great way to meet people who share your interest.

#### **BREED IMPROVEMENT**

The Breed Survey scheme is the cornerstone of breed improvement. Prior to breeding, each animal is presented to a panel of qualified Breed Surveyors who assess its breed value as compared to the Breed Standard. To be classified as suitable for breeding the animal must be considered above the breed average, both physically and temperamentally. Animals that cannot achieve successful classification are not recommended for breeding. Prior to submitting to a Survey each animal must have passed the Hip and Elbow Dysplasia schemes. This dedication by the GSDCV/GSDCA breeders has been responsible for the continued improvement of both the quality and health of the German Shepherd Dog, not only in Victoria but also Australia wide.

#### **GSDCV ACTIVITIES**

The GSDCV offers various training at branches throughout Victoria. Training starts with puppy class and then progresses to basic obedience to give you sufficient control of your dog. Certain branches offer additional training in areas such as showing, tracking, agility, and Demonstration Team Handling. Various publications, lectures and film nights are provided to help promote knowledge and an understanding of the breed. The GSDCV also runs fun day competitions and other fun social activities throughout the year.

#### TRAINING

The **GSDCV** "Promotes Responsible Ownership by the Socialisation and Training of the German Shepherd Dog". Puppies from eight weeks of age can begin their socialisation and training at one of our training branches, however dogs of any age can always start training and owners can receive instruction in the training of their dog. Our club has eleven branches, ten of which are obedience based and one which is solely for the training for those members who show their dogs or to put their dog through Breed Survey. Branches teach Responsible Dog Ownership so that handlers are aware of local dog laws. If you wish to commence training your German Shepherd then after finding out about the branch nearest you, both you and your dog would be most welcome to join our club and train at one of the listed branches.

#### WHERE CAN YOU SEE THE GSDCV?

The GSDCV regularly attends various local council Pet Expos and Shows, Dogs Victoria pet expo activities and the Royal Melbourne Show. At these events you will find a GSD breed stand, can see GSD's performing

demonstrations and take the opportunity to interact with the dogs and ask questions.
