1.1 Annual Dual Trophy (May 2008)

Shows / Trials eligible for scoring:

GSDCV State Breed Exhibition and Restricted Trial (March)

GSDCV Championship Show and Restricted Trial (May)

GSDCSA Championship Show and Restricted Trial (June)

GSDCSA Championship Show and Restricted Trial (June)

GSDCV Championship Show and Restricted Trial (November)

GSDCA National Show and Restricted Trial

GSDCA Main Breed Exhibition and Restricted Trial

Note: In any year that the GSDCA National Show / Trial takes the place of any of the above, then this list will change accordingly for that year only.

Trophy to be awarded to the team which wins the most Dual Trophies at the above listed GSDCA affiliated events, with two (2) being the minimum number to qualify.

In the event of a tie (i.e.: 2 or more teams each winning the same amount of Dual Trophies, the winner will be decided by points system as follows:

For each Show Grading:

Excellent Select: 500

Excellent: 435

Very Good Merit: 370 Very Good: 305 Good: 240

Which will then be added to the total number of points gained in the Trial ring from the qualifying scores achieved.

In the event that no team wins the trophy under the above conditions, then the following Show / Trial combinations may be added in order to qualify.

Shows and trials have been paired, and a show grading, together with a qualifying score in the paired trial must be achieved. Any team who wins only one Dual Trophy (as above) may add any, or all of the following to enable qualification.

Qualification is as above. Minimum two (2) show gradings, with qualifying scores from the paired trials.

BHGSDC Championship Show (August) 2nd Dogs Vic. Obedience Dog of Year Trial (Park)

BHGSDC Championship Show (August) 3rd Dogs Vic. National Obedience Trial (Park)

ACTGSDC Championship Show (4th October) 12th Knox Obedience Trial (Scoresby)

ACTGSDC Championship Show (5th October) 12th Knox Obedience Trial (Scoresby)

Points for these Show / Trial combinations to be calculated as follows:

For each Show Grading:

Excellent: 370 Very Good: 240 Good: 175

Which will then be added to the total number of points gained in the Trial ring from the qualifying scores achieved.

Obedience points only come into play if there are two, or more dogs tied on gradings.

If a dog wins one (1) Dual Trophy only, and wishes to enter the trials on the second list to qualify, then the points scenario would be as follows:

The lowest possible Dual Trophy (Exc. gradings) score would be 145, covering 2 show / trial combinations.

The highest possible score from a non Dual Trophy winner (Exc. Gradings), covering 2 trials, would be 940

The only way the non Dual Trophy qualifier could beat a Dual Trophy qualifier, would be to qualify in 3 out of the 4 show trial combinations from the second list.

This list of points is scaled the same as the one in the first list, so the highest graded dog will always win, regardless of obedience points gained. As already mentioned, the obedience scores will only come into play if two dogs are tied on gradings.

1.2 RULES FOR THE WALTER REIMANN "DUAL PERFORMANCE TROPHY" (March 2013)

It has been decided to adopt the following modified rules for the award of Dual Performance Trophies at Victorian shows, in line with the new rules proposed for adoption at Nationals in the future, since the introduction of Long Stock Coat classes.

- To be eligible, a Dog or Bitch must achieve, as minimum, a grading of Very Good in a conformation class and a qualifying score in Novice, Open, Utility or Utility Dog Excellent class in the Obedience Trial.
 - The Dual Performance Trophy will be awarded to the animal that has the highest grading in conformation and a qualifying score in obedience.
 - o If grading is equal, then the following scoring system shall be used to determine the winner:

The scoring system sees a formula applied: The score shall be determined by the number of times that grading is given in the conformation class, divided by the placing of the dog that has qualified, which is then multiplied by 100.

A = Number of Grading given

B = Placing of dog that has qualified with that grading

 $A/B \times 100 = Final Score (no decimal places)$

- In the event of a tied result after applying all the criteria above, then the Obedience result will determine the winner, with criteria being, in the following order:
 - The animal that gained the highest qualifying score in Obedience Trial will be declared the winner.
 - o If the qualifying scores are still equal, the winner will be decided as follows:
 - Tied scores within the same class will be separated by final placing gained within the particular class. e.g.: 1st place UDX (190 points) beats 2nd place UDX (190 points) etc.

Tied scores from different classes will be separated by placing them in order of the class the animal competed in hence as an example: UDX beats (190 points) beats UD (190 points) which beat OPEN (190 points) etc.
